## Waikerie Christmas

WAIKERIE is the ideal place to celebrate Christmas and is quickly becoming known as Destination Christmas.

The community has been working hard to abide by Covid-19 restrictions and ensure the town can still enjoy the festive season.

Visit the Christmas Tree Trail in Waikerie's Federation Park, behind the Rain Moth Gallery.

The 130 beautiful 3D wooden Christmas trees, which are 2.4m or 1.8m tall and lit by solar lights, have been up since November 22 and reflect the close knit community spirit of the town.

The project is an initiative of the District Council of Loxton Waikerie and the Waikerie Christmas Decoration Working Group and is in its third year.

Working Group spokesperson, Donna Matthews, said community groups, schools and local businesses were all invited to decorate a tree.

"They were able to decorate it with their

own choice of theme and colour," Ms Matthews said.

The Christmas trees will be on display until January 16.

Waikerie's famous Santa's Cave at the Waikerie Institute will have more activities for the children this year following an easing of Covid-19 restrictions.

The global pandemic last year prevented Santa from coming to the cave, but this year he will be back

The cave opened on November 27 and closes on Christmas Eve.

Waikerie Santa's Cave committee secretary, Jan Centofanti, said a grant obtained from the District Council of Loxton Waikerie enabled them to purchase a new chair for Santa.

Children can visit Santa at the cave during the school term from 3.00pm to 4.00pm each weekday.

During the weekends and school holidays he will be at the cave from 10.00am to 4.00pm

Mrs Centofanti said people will be able to purchase Christmas gifts and the committee has made about 450 bags of honey biscuits to sell.

More magical Christmas displays and lights will be featured this year including Anthony Leske's toy machine and the popular Ferris wheel

On December 18, the Waikerie Rotary Riverfront Christmas Night Market will be the ideal venue to share some festive

The event will be licensed and feature a variety of stalls including food, local produce, candles, clothing and skincare.

Waikerie Rotary Riverfront Christmas Night Market coordinator, Sonia Fowler, said Santa is expected to be at the market to greet the children and it will be the ideal place for Christmas shopping.

"You will have the opportunity to purchase some lovely Christmas gifts made by local craftspeople," she said.

#### **Christmas Tree Trail**

November 22, 2021 until January 16, 2022

Waikerie's Christmas Tree Trail in Federation Park behind the Rain Moth Gallery features more than 130 3D wooden trees, which are 2.4m or 1.8m tall and have been decorated by local schools, community groups, and businesses. The perfect time to visit is at dusk. Following the switching on of the Norfolk Pine's Christmas lights, the solar lights on the trees along the trail will gradually turn on.



#### Santa's Cave

The elf count and the jolly man in the red suit both return to Santa's Cave this year. Children can count how many elves are in the cave and be rewarded with a lollypop. Visitors to the cave will see more magical Christmas displays than last year, due to an easing in some Covid-19 restrictions. Locally made gifts and Waikerie's famous honey biscuits will be available to purchase.


#### Waikerie Rotary Riverfront Christmas Night Market

## **Berri Christmas**

CHRISTMAS spirit will be alive and well in Berri this December, with two major community events set to bring the town to life.

Berri businesses have again come together to organise the annual Santa's Cave, inside the Alfresco's building on Vaughan Terrace.

The event, organised by the Berri Traders group, will run over three Saturdays on December 4, 11 and 18, giving locals plenty of opportunities to partake in the festivities.

Berri Traders group member and event organiser Elvssa Thurmer said the cave would feature a range of activities for children and families to enjoy.

"We will have free face painting, a sausage sizzle and also an ice-cream van," she said.

"Last year's event was very successful, despite having the weather of all the seasons over the three weeks, so we are excited to be able to hold the cave at the Alfresco's building again.

"The local traders are looking forward to having people coming into the CBD and bringing their Christmas cheer to Berri."

The event is also supported by the Berri Barmera Council, while several community groups will also chip in and volunteer their time to make help make the cave a reality

"The Rotary Club of Berri will be helping us out on the Saturday mornings, some of the Our Town Berri committee will also be there helping, and members of the Zonta Club of the Riverland will be helping Trevor Scott and Robert Gruzlewski from Elders on the barbecue," Ms Thurmer said.

"There is definitely a strong community effort making this event possible.'

Ms Thurmer said the event would be Covid-safe and comply with all Covid-19 restrictions.

"We are working closely with council and monitoring to see how the situation develops," she said.

Following the cave's launch, the town's annual Carols by the River will make its return to Riverview Drive along the Berri river front on Sunday, December 5.

This year's carols, put together by the Berri Barmera Christian Churches and supported by council, will feature a number of guest artists, including 2019 The Voice contestant and Zimbabwean cricket player Henry Olonga.

The event will also include a children's puppet show, called The Best Gift Ever. backed by a band and carollers.

Coffee, ice-cream and drinks will be available to purchase, with attendees encouraged to bring along their own picnic, a chair or picnic rug.

Everyone is welcome to take part in this year's carols, which kick off at 6pm for a 7pm start.



# Christmas reindeer brownies Ingredients 150g butter 275g (1 ¼ cups) caster sugar 75g (¾ cup) cocoa powder 2 tsp vanilla extract 3 eggs 75g (½ cup) plain flour **Decorations** 200g pretzels 200g pretzels 250g milk chocolate melted 200g packet Jaffas 130g silver cachous (edible balls)

#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 160° and line a 20cm square tin with baking paper.
- Place the butter into a microwave-safe bowl Heat for 1 minute.
- Add the caster sugar and cocoa powder and stir.
- Heat in the microwave on 30 second bursts (50% power) until melted and combined - stirring each time.
- Allow to cool slightly.
- Add the vanilla extract and the eggs and whisk until combined.
- Sift the plain flour into the bowl and mix gently.
- Pour the brownie mixture into the prepared tin and bake for 30 minutes or until just cooked through (do not overcook).
- Leave in the tin to cool completely
- Trim any raised edges off the brownie so you have a completely flat square brownie.
- Turn the brownie over onto a flat board.
- 12. Cut the brownie into 16 equal rectangles
- 13. Cut the pretzels in half using a sharp knife.
- 14. Press the pretzels into the top of the brownie pieces for 'antlers'.15. Spread melted milk chocolate over the front of the brownie pieces
- (do a couple at a time so that the chocolate doesn't set too quickly).
- 16. Add a Jaffa for the nose and 2 silver cachous for the eyes.
- 17. Trim the candy canes with a knife so that you have small straight pieces (approx 6 cm in length). Insert the candy cane into the base of the brownie pieces.

### **Blueberry and** blackberry spritz

150g fresh or frozen blackberries 80g blueberries 1 tbsp maple syrup 1 cup crushed ice 600ml chilled raspberry-flavoured sparkling mineral water or sparkling mineral water Thyme sprigs, to serve



#### Method

Place the blackberries, blueberries and maple syrup in a blender and blend until smooth.

Pour the blackberry mixture into serving glasses. Top with ice, mineral water and thyme sprigs to serve.
